David R. Shumway ist Professor für Englisch, Literatur- und Kulturwissenschaften und außerdem der Leiter der Geisteswissenschaften an der Carnegie Mellon Universität. Er lehrt Film, Popmusik, Amerikanische Erzählliteratur des späten 19. und 20. Jahrhunderts sowie Literatur- und Kulturtheorien. Zurzeit stellt er ein Buch über Rockstars als Kulturikonen fertig und arbeitet an einer Studie über John Sayles für die Reihe „Contemporary Directors Series“ der University of Illinois Press.

David R. Shumway is Professor of English, and Literary and Cultural Studies, and Director of the Humanities Center at Carnegie Mellon University. He teaches courses in film, popular music, late nineteenth- and twentieth-century American fiction, and in literary and cultural theory. Currently, he is finishing a book about rock stars as cultural icons, and he is at work on a study of John Sayles for the Contemporary Directors Series of the University of Illinois Press.
